



## **The African Bermuda Dispersion Cultural Tour**

The African Bermuda Dispersion Cultural Tour is visiting The City of Hamilton and join us for a 2-hour walking tour that includes the following stops. The tour will highlight the 400 years of Parliament in Bermuda.

### **Highlights:**

1. Stop outside "The Cathedral" – an iconic city landmark and learn about the early establishment of Bermuda in the 1600's and the English colonists that arrived here.
2. Stop outside "The House of Parliament" – an historic landmark and learn about Britain's Westminster system of laws in Bermuda during and after slavery.
3. Visit to Sarah "Sally" Bassett sculpture at Cabinet Grounds- An Enslaved woman accused of poisoning a slave owner, and being the ringleader of the poisoning plots in the 1700's.
4. Visit "We Arrive" sculpture at Barr's Bay Park – A story about a ship that entered Bermuda and the fate of those onboard.
5. Visit "When Voices Rise Sculpture" at City Hall – Learn about the groups that help to end segregation in Bermuda.

### **Itinerary:**

**Departure point:** Departure from Freedom Square (City Hall) in Hamilton, based on the scheduled booked times, and this will be the return location.

Please ensure to arrive at least 10 minutes early for check in and to ensure an on-time departure. The tour is 2 hours & will depart promptly at the scheduled times.
